## Women Helping Women *Soroptimists Care About Women's Health*

Knowing the importance of women's access to quality health care, Pat Acklin, president of Soroptimist International of Ashland, hand-delivered a check to the Ashland Community Hospital Foundation for \$5,000 to support this year's Patrons Campaign for the Women's Health Initiative. # Donors Make a Difference as Hospital Adds Services

There has been a flurry of activity since I wrote to you in the spring. It's hard to believe that summer is over and we are starting to plan for 2016.

As I look ahead, I'm reminded of how critical you are to our work. You have made so many important projects and services possible at Asante Ashland Community Hospital. You have helped us save lives, mend bodies, cure illnesses, and bring babies into the world. I hope you share my joy and pride in your accomplishments.

Our work continues as we partner with you to support two exciting and significant initiatives at our hospital. Both are designed to expand services to our community and offer excellent care, close to home.

### Urology Services

Asante Ashland Community Hospital heard from our patients and primary care physicians that they wanted urology services in Ashland. And the hospital listened. The Rogue Valley Urology Group has begun offering urology surgery at the hospital. Phase I of this initiative is underway with the urologists performing basic surgeries now. The foundation is securing contributions for Phase II, which will create a urol-



ogy suite at the hospital that will be equipped for more complex surgeries.

### Women's Health

Earlier this year, we launched our 2015 Patrons Campaign to support women's health. We are partnering with our community to fund three important projects:

- Asante Ashland Community Hospital is expanding surgical options for women. To support this effort, the foundation is securing donations to purchase equipment for gynecologic and breast-reconstruction surgeries.
- Plans are underway to buy state-of-the-art breast tomography equipment. Tomography is expected to become the gold standard for breast imaging because it improves radiologists' ability to diagnose with confidence.
- Finally, we are creating a Women's Care Fund to help women get the medical care they need, regardless of their ability to pay.

You are important to the success and vitality of our hospital. Thank you for partnering with us to keep Asante Ashland Community Hospital alive and well.

## We Care: Employees Make an Impact on Patient Care

Valerie Chamberlain, a donor and employee, is among those at Asante Ashland Community Hospital participating in a new program to keep patients comfortable called the Caregiver Fund.

Launched last year, the Caregiver Fund is supported entirely by donations from staff and volunteers, who also propose how the gifts will be used. The program is designed to develop employee-driven ideas for initiatives, tools, equipment, and education that will reduce waste, improve quality and safety, and enhance patients' experiences.

Any employee at Asante Ashland can submit an idea for consideration for up to \$10,000 in funding. Requests are reviewed by a committee made up of clinical and nonclinical front-line staff from over a dozen departments.

Over the summer, the committee awarded \$15,000 toward installing or replacing TVs in several patient rooms. For patients recovering from surgery, receiving infusions, or otherwise having to bide their time in a patient room, the distraction of a television can provide comfort and ease anxiety.

Valerie Chamberlain shared:

"I am thrilled that there is a program that will allow all of us to make a financial contribution that will leave a lasting impact on patient care, including those of us who can only give a consistent, modest amount," she said. "I give because I am convinced that as a health care organization, AACH has many unique features to offer the community."

# Sustaining a Dream

## Aspiring Nurse Credits Scholarship Donor with Helping Her Reach Goal

Thanks to the William G. and Ruth T. Evans Endowed Nursing Scholarship, Shannan Widboom is closing in on her dream of becoming a nurse and building a career helping others.

Shannan wanted to be a nurse for as long as she could remember. She had a difficult childhood, growing up in poverty and living at times in homeless shelters. She pored through nursing books and practiced nursing skills on her stuffed animals.

At the age of 18 she gave birth to her son, whose father died in a car accident two years later. Shannan persevered: raising her son, now 18, marrying, and caring for both of her grandparents as they passed away while in hospice. She got a job as a file clerk at a Rogue Valley radiology group and was soon promoted into a management position. However, the great recession struck, and Shannan and her husband lost their jobs and then their home.

Realizing that her lack of a college degree was preventing her from getting a well-paying job, Shannan enrolled in college, selling everything of value to pay her tuition. She also earned a scholarship from the fund endowed by the Evans.

“Without this generous scholarship, I would not have had the means to accomplish what I have,” says Shannan, who has received the scholarship for the past three years.

Today, Shannan is in her final year in the OHSU nursing program at SOU. She works two jobs, is the president of the Ashland OHSU Student Nurse Association, and has maintained a cumulative 3.95 GPA.

She is one of 11 students in the OHSU nursing program at SOU and Rogue Community College who received a total of \$52,500 in scholarships from the William G. and Ruth T. Evans Endowed Nursing Scholarship this year. She and three other past recipients are on track to graduate in 2016.

Ruth Evans established the endowed nursing scholarship in 2002. A nurse herself, Ruth recognized the need for nurses and the importance of education. Although Mrs. Evans passed away in 2013, her legacy continues in the form a \$2.5 million bequest directed to nursing scholarships, among other areas.

Since the creation of the scholarship, 90 local nursing students have received 135 scholarships totaling \$258,433. New this year is the inclusion of the Rogue Community College Practical Nursing Program. Thirteen graduating students each received a scholarship to cover the cost of their state application and exam fees for a total of \$5,518.50.

Shannan speaks for all those who have benefited from Ruth Evans’ generosity. “The generous giving heart and spirit of Ruth Evans inspires me to achieve not only my dreams, but to help others achieve theirs.”


Longtime supporters Sid and Barbara Field know.
